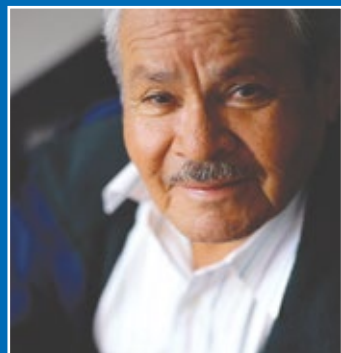

Electronic Prescribing eRx



Electronic prescribing can help you.

Electronic prescribing (sometimes called “eRx”) is a way for doctors and other prescribers to write and send your prescriptions directly to your pharmacy. This means no more prescriptions on paper and less time waiting to have your prescription filled. Usually, all you need to do is go to your pharmacy and pick up the prescription. It’s that simple. Electronic prescribing can save you time and money, and help keep you safe.

Electronic prescribing can keep you safe

- Doctors and other prescribers will have secure access to your medication history, so they can watch out for possible drug interactions, allergies, or other warnings.
- Electronic prescriptions are easier for the pharmacist to read than handwritten prescriptions. This means there’s less chance you’ll accidentally get the wrong drug or dose.



Electronic prescribing can save time & money

- Prescribers can check which drugs your insurance covers that might work for you and cost you less.
- You don’t have to drop off your prescription in person.
- Your pharmacist will get your prescriptions faster, so they can start working on it sooner.
- You don’t have to worry about misplacing a prescription, like you do with paper prescriptions.
- In many cases, the pharmacy will contact you when your prescription is ready, which lets you pick up your prescription at your convenience.
